#### **HOW TO SCHEDULE A RIDE**

- Contact the Program Partner (Listed in this guide).
- Provide your name, trip origin and destination, day of travel and time of appointment, and name of anyone accompanying you.
- Receive confirmation from Program Partner and you are ready to ride!

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Who are the volunteer drivers?

Volunteer drivers are verified by background checks, have a clean driving record, and complete a vehicle safety inspection.

## Do you have to live in Rutland County to use Everybody Rides?

Yes, but Program Partners can provide rides to destinations outside of Rutland County.

## Do you need advanced notice before scheduling a ride?

Yes, advanced notice is preferred, and varies by Program Partner. Please call ahead to determine the appropriate notice.

#### Is Priority given based on trip type?


